Dear Friends of Rock Haven,

Easter is my favorite day of the year and Spring is my favorite season. As Christians, we have the hope of our salvation not only because of what Jesus did on the cross, but also by walking out of the tomb. Spring, with all the flowers blooming and colors popping, is a reminder of the new life we have in Christ. For several years, Rock Haven Ministries has been partnering with Newton County Baptist Church to host the annual Egg Drop Eggstravaganza. This year we went to Mount Judea and dropped 10,000 candyfilled eggs from a helicopter. Prior to the drop, we were able to provide a carnival-like experience for the children while all the kids were being registered. Dear Friends for Rock Haven,

"I was mad, and I didn't want to go to camp!". A cousin of mine shared her testimony with me recently. Her first experience with Rock Haven had been in the mid 1970's. She told me that she did not want to go to camp. After hearing her reason why, I could see why. Family issues played a big part in it and let's just say because of that she really didn't want to be at Rock Haven, and I didn't blame her for feeling that way. When she arrived though, she said that she couldn't get away from this one thing. She was loved on. The cabin leaders, the LIT's, the cooks, the speakers all of them made her feel special. She told me that from those examples and from the preaching and teaching that she realized that she wasn't saved and needed Christ. So, she concocted a plan. On the very last night of camp, she would go forward, so that there wouldn't be a big thing made from it because she was going home the next day. Her plan was not God's plan. She said she made it to Thursday night and was convicted so much that she went forward and accepted Christ as her personal Savior. Her life was so turned around that the next summer she came back as an LIT, with the same attitude of those people who had loved on her.

Why do I believe in the ministry of Rock Haven Bible Camp? When I hear these personal testimonies of individuals whose lives were changed when they attended camp, I am constantly reminded of the purpose and intent of this ministry. To see lives changed for Christ. And her testimony also reminds of what it takes to do this. The one primary factor that will influence a life for Christ is Godly people who exemplify Christ. Cabin leaders, SWAT, program leaders, speakers all are vital for the Holy Spirit to work in the life of a youth who attends here. Many of those who attend camp don't have the best home life or have examples in their lives to follow. So, for those few days that they attend Rock Haven, we want them to experience those type of examples. Godly leaders!

Have you ever considered volunteering to a ministry like Rock Haven? Because of the nature of our ministry, we do focus on finding cabin leaders. To be able to use the cabins we need a minimum of 16 cabin leaders a week, we need three to four volunteers per week in the kitchen. We also need lifeguards, program people, and maintenance. And then all of these people come together for one to four weeks to exemplify Christ to the youth who attend. It is challenging yet rewarding. I think of the old hymn that goes," Burdens are lifted at

Calvary!". Many youth have had burdens lifted when they met Jesus here.
